Your CEO and Directors spend time every year reaching out to our legislators and regulatory agencies to present our issues and to discuss how legislation or new regulations will impact our Cooperative. We went to Washington, DC during the week of April 22nd to work with our National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) and to meet with our Members of Congress to explain our needs and to clarify our concerns with recent regulatory actions such as the pace of the transition away from fossil fuels. Reliability is an overriding concern that affects all of us and could threaten human health and safety in the event of an extended freeze in the winter or heat wave in the summer. We are all part of an interconnected interstate electric grid so delivery disruptions at distance, even several states away, can affect our reliability and pricing as well. We will continue to advocate for your best interests in every way that we can.
