## Newsletter Update on COVID-19

COVID-19 is the most serious public health challenge of our lifetimes and it appears that we will have to deal with this for a few months at least. OEC has taken quick action to help our communities and to protect our members and workers. Our electric line and brush crews are currently working in shifts to ensure that if anyone contracts the virus, no more than one-half of our crew might be quarantined as a result of an exposure. This will allow us to always have crews on call and ready to go if we have any power outages. Keeping the power on is job #1 here at OEC. As always, we are also working with our members who may be struggling with their bills to help get through these challenging economic times. We will do what we can within reason to help those who are in dire need at this time.

We have also been getting many requests to get our OEConnect broadband service connected as soon as possible so customers can telework and do online coursework. We have given the highest priority to our medical and health care professionals who need connectivity 24 hours a day right now. We are also giving priority to students and teleworkers. We also are prepared to help anyone who needs telemedicine access. We are still working as fast as we can to get the final phases of construction and splicing done to enable service throughout our service area. We are thankful that we can help in many areas already and we are working hard to finish more areas as soon as possible. Due to the importance of this service, we are continuing to do in-home installations for the time being. However, this can be very risky for you and for our workers who are coming into your home. If you are sick or if you have a condition that makes you susceptible to the virus, you should not have service installed at this time. When installing in your home, all of us will need to maintain safe social distances at all times (not less than 6 feet). Please clean and clear the install area before we arrive to minimize the time spent in the home. These are very trying times for all of us but we will get through this if we all stick together. Let's keep our social distances. Thank you and be safe and well. – Tim Johnson, CEO

We offer Budget Billing to help make your planning a little easier. We are starting to re-evaluate budgets this month for the upcoming 2020-2021 year. Budget billing takes the annual average of what your usage has been and gives you one amount that you will pay monthly for a year so that you always know how much you will be paying. Occasionally we will need to make adjustments to these estimates especially when we have periods of extreme cold or heat. If you are currently part of the Budget Billing program, you will receive a letter from our office if your monthly payment has changed. ## \*\*\*Election and Nominating Committee Notice\*\*\*

All members are hereby notified that, as set forth in the bylaws of Otsego Electric Cooperative, Inc., the Board of Directors appoints a Nominating Committee every year. The Nominating Committee will meet during the month of June to review petitions and select the list of nominees for open director seats.

The Nominating Committee meets within 75 days of the Cooperative's Annual Member's Meeting. There will be an election of two new board members this year at the Cooperative Annual Meeting on August 19, 2020. If you are a co-op member and interested in becoming an Otsego Electric Cooperative Board Member, petitions will need to be in by June 1, 2020. Each interested candidate is referred to Article IV Section 2 of the Bylaws regarding qualifications to become a Board Member.

Article 4, Section 3 of the bylaws follows:

**NOMINATIONS.** It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to appoint, not less than thirty days nor more than seventy-five days before the date of a meeting of the members at which directors are to be elected, a committee on nominations and elections consisting of five members who shall be selected from different sections of the project area so as to insure equitable representation. No member of the Board of Directors may serve on such committee. The committee, keeping in mind the principle of equitable representation, shall review, certify and post at the principal office of the Cooperative at least twenty days before the meeting a list of nominations for directors. Any fifteen or more members acting together shall make nominations by petition not less than seventy-five days prior to the meeting. In the event adequate nominations are not received and certified, the nominations and elections committee will have the authority to appoint nominees. The Secretary shall be responsible for mailing with the notice of the meeting or separately, but at least ten days before the date of the meeting, a statement of the number of directors to be elected and the names and addresses of the certified candidates.

This year's Annual Meeting will take place at the Unadilla Valley School in New Berlin, NY. If you are interested in running for the Board of Directors, petitions are available at the Cooperative office or at our website at [www.otsegoec.coop](http://www.otsegoec.coop).
